


# Chris McVey Diagnosed with Esophageal Cancer January 2016

I started having trouble swallowing food, and that led me to go the doctor; which led to a series of tests at CRMC. My doctor ordered an EGD. This procedure examines the lining of the esophagus, stomach and duodenum via a small camera on a tube. The diagnosis came back as cancer.

My treatment consisted of radiation therapy, followed by chemotherapy, followed by surgery. The radiation and chemo treatments were completed by June 2016. Two weeks later I underwent surgery to remove most of my esophagus—the remaining esophagus was then stretched to connect it to the stomach. The nurses and doctors in all those areas were excellent. Alice and Jennifer in radiation took such good care of me. When I developed an unusually high heart rate, Sharon in chemotherapy dropped what she was doing, grabbed a wheelchair and took me down to the ER. Those ladies took good care of me.

Because I have lived in this community for years, I happen to know a lot of people in town and some of those are at the hospital. When I started radiation, Dr. Uy was my doctor. When he was a kid, he was one of my Taekwondo students where I taught martial arts. I also knew Alice and Jennifer through different connections, so I knew I was in good hands with these good people. Plus my wife is a nurse and has worked at CRMC as well as other places in the area.

I will continue to go to CRMC because I know the people there are top notch; they care for you like a family member. I highly recommend this hospital to anyone.

I have worked for Kanoma Co-op and the Bartlett Co-op for the past 35 years. Genette, my wife of 38 years is still active as a nurse. In my spare time I enjoy golf and the grandkids.

My advice for someone facing cancer: Stay focused and positive. Get up every morning and get it done.

### Diagnosed with Ductal Carcinoma In Situ Breast Cancer 2017

I normally had my annual mammogram in October, but was way too busy and decided to put it off. When I finally got tested the radiologist said there were some areas of concern, so I had a biopsy at Hillcrest in Tulsa. When the doctor said it was cancer, I didn't even begin to know how to react and I cried all the way home that day. I underwent a lumpectomy at St John, with radiation the next step. The doctor gave me a choice of going to Bartlesville or Coffeyville. When I chose Coffeyville I was glad I did.

I started with radiation and was glad to learn that Dr. Uy works closely with my surgeon when he is in Tulsa. The care I received at CRMC was top notch—the nurses, doctors, lab technicians and volunteers were so accommodating and made me feel so comfortable from the beginning to the end. It was a delight to meet Mrs. Tatman, who works as a volunteer, the first time I went to see Dr. Ogundipe. Everyone was so thoughtful—your comfort seems to be the number one goal at CRMC. When I had both my biopsy and lumpectomy in Tulsa, I felt like a number going through the assembly line. CRMC made me feel like I was the most important patient of the day.

There was a huge benefit to having my treatments at CRMC because I was able to travel 17 miles to Coffeyville versus 45 miles to Bartlesville, which allowed me to keep working almost full time. After I finished my radiation treatments, I don't think I could have traveled very far. It's amazing how exhausted you become.

The employees at CRMC were a very important part to my support system. Cathy and Jennifer were so kind it had me looking forward to radiation. Having such great care close to home is so reassuring.

I would recommend for someone who is facing cancer to build your support system—those individuals who will be there to support you during and after your treatment. Reach out to people; they really want to help but sometimes don't know how. If you don't have family or close friends, find a group to join (church, Weight Watchers, etc.)

My normal life consists of working a full-time job and I care for my husband who has health issues. My 15-year old son, Christopher loves to play golf and I go ride in the cart with him every chance I get. I love being outside. And every night, my rescue dog that is part Chow and part St. Bernard takes me for a walk to make sure I get my exercise.







# Teresa Bonham Diagnosed with Ductal Carcinoma Breast Cancer – 2017


My journey with breast cancer began when I went to see Dr. Wiebe who asked me when was the last time I had a mammogram. It had been four years. So an appointment was made and the mammogram revealed a suspicious area, which led to having a biopsy. Dr. Lin did the biopsy and it turned out to be Stage 1 Ductal Carcinoma. I went back two weeks later and he removed one lymph node that was negative for cancer.

The course of treatment was to have radiation (no chemotherapy). I had 16 sessions of radiation. All the staff was great, but Alice really stood out because she just had a way about her and was so caring. I had no trouble with the treatments except a small rash toward the end, which was treated and went away. The overall experience from the time of diagnosis to completing my treatments was very good and everyone was so helpful.

I have told different people that I don't want to go anywhere else because CRMC offers great care by great people. It's much easier having treatments done close to home.

Now I see Dr. Ogundipe every three months and everything has been fine. I would tell someone who is facing cancer to have faith, have strength and have courage.

I was born and raised in Coffeyville. George and I have been married 25 years. We have two daughters and a son, and grandchildren ages 16 to 2. Both of us are retired, but are always on the go. We enjoy going to the casino and I like to play games on my iPad. I'm a big Kansas City Chiefs fan, but my favorite thing is cooking for my family. I love to cook.

In 1980, CRMC Radiation Department was established and in 1983 the CRMC Medical Oncology department started offering a complete program for the diagnosis and treatment for cancer patients.

Jennifer has been part of the Radiation Oncology team for 24 years as a radiation therapist. She is also a Certified Medical Dosimetrist

(CMD) and started performing those duties in 2005. A Medical Dosimetrist works with a Radiation Oncologist (Dr. Uy) to create a specific treatment plan for each patient. The treatment plan is designed by means of a computer to determine a treatment field technique that will deliver that prescribed radiation dose to a defined tumor volume. Consideration is given on dose-limiting structures that might include the eye when treating the brain, the heart when treating the lung or the spinal cord when it is near the treatment volume. The CMD makes sure the treatment plan has the correct dosage delivered to the specific tumor volume.

"I knew when I started X-ray school that I wanted to continue my training and specialize," said Jennifer. As a student we were able to visit specialty modalities to learn more about them. I chose to spend some time in radiation oncology and it only took me a few hours on the first visit to know I was where I was meant to be."

Jennifer has been married to Randy for twenty years. They have two grown children, three grandchildren and another on the way. Jennifer enjoys trail riding, reading, traveling...and her cat.

Ashleigh has been a registered nurse for 17 years.



## Physician Spotlight General Concepts in Infertility

Infertility or the difficulty in conceiving a child is a substantial medical issue and afflicts up to 10% of all couples in the general population. While infertility is not considered a serious illness such as cancer, it nevertheless could be substantially debilitating in many ways for the infertile couple.

Infertility is defined as the inability of a couple to conceive within 12 months of regular unprotected intercourse. This waiting period is based on the fact that approximately 80-90% of couples should conceive within one year with this number increasing to 95% after 2 years. Since infertility investigation and therapy could be both expensive and invasive, physicians generally recommend the 1 year waiting period before initiating or referring for infertility management. For women 35 years of age or older, this waiting period is shortened to 6 months due to the potential for very rapid decline in their fertility in this age group. The waiting period is also not necessary if the couple would have an obvious source for their infertility such as prior tubal ligation, absence of regular ovulation, etc.

A conception requires a sperm to fertilize an ovum. This means medically that:


- 1. An adequate amount of functioning sperm could be produced.
- 2. Regular ovulation occurs to release an ovum at regular intervals.
- 3. A patent and functional tube exists to conduct a passage for sperm to the ovum.

Infertility therefore could be caused by one or more abnormalities in sperm, ovulation or tube. Basic infertility investigation is direct at evaluating these parameters in a couple with sperm analysis for the man, ovulation testing with blood or urine test for the woman and an X-ray to determine tubal patency. Once these basic tests are completed, specific therapy directed at overcoming the fertility deficiency could be initiated. Some examples of therapy may include insemination to overcome sperm deficiencies, ovulation induction to allow a woman to ovulate normally, tubal surgery to open blocked tubes plus others.

It is important to keep in mind that natural human conception rate per month is only 25% with infertility couples having a monthly fertility rate being much less. The goal of infertility management is to improve the infertile couple's month fertility rate above their baseline beyond just natural intercourse.

In summary, infertility is a fairly common medical issue and often occurs unexpectedly.

Substantial medical assistance can be provided by medical experts specializing in infertility management. With appropriate and timely intervention most infertile couples could expect to ultimately achieve what they desire most-delivering a healthy baby.

### WHEN TO SEE A Doctor

You probably don't need to see a doctor about infertility unless you have been trying regularly to conceive for at least one year. Talk with your doctor earlier, however, if you're a woman and:

- You're age 35 to 40 and have been trying to conceive for six months or longer
- You're over age 40
- You menstruate irregularly or not at all
- Your periods are very painful
- You have known fertility problems
- You've been diagnosed with endometriosis or pelvic inflammatory disease
- You've had multiple miscarriages
- You've undergone treatment for cancer

# Billing Services Now In-House at CRMC


